1

(36 credits)

5th-Year Track for Longwood Undergraduates

Enter as a freshman. In five years, you will earn your liberal studies degree, teacher licensure, and a graduate degree in special education with an option for dual endorsement in elementary education.

(39 credits*)

Licensure Track for Career Switchers

Enter with your BA or BS in any field and earn your master's and teacher licensure in as little as 39 credits.

*Two prerequisite courses may be required.

3

(39 credits)

Licensed Teacher Track

Enter as a licensed Virginia teacher. Earn your graduate degree in one year.

Whether you're starting your career, switching careers, or looking to advance your career, you can enroll to become a master's level SPED teacher. By planning ahead, undergraduates can take 36 credits in a fifth year to earn their master's degree. Licensed Virginia teachers earn their master's degree in 39 credits. Those with a bachelor's degree in any field can earn their master's in as little as 39 credit hours. This program provides all students the tools, experience, and knowledge to be a master's level licensed special education teacher or to support special education students in a general education classroom.

- ✓ **Official bachelor's degree transcripts** from an accredited college or university and all transcripts for subsequent coursework.
- ✓ **A minimum overall undergraduate GPA of 2.75+ (on 4.0 scale)**

- ✓ **500+ word essay** addressing reasons for seeking graduate education in Special Education
- ✓ **Resume**
- ✓ **Two letters of recommendation** (Initial Licensure and Licensed Teacher Tracks Only)
- ✓ **Passing VCLA Reading & Writing scores** and passing Praxis Teaching Reading scores (Initial Licensure Track Only)
- ✓ **Valid VA teaching license** or equivalent from another state (Licensed Teacher Track Only)
